
Ear Tag Order for 2016 State Fair of Texas

Time is fast approaching to make decisions on how many ear tags you will need for the upcoming 2016 State Fair of Texas (lamb, goats, barrows). The deadline for ordering tags is Monday, April 18th. Please call or come by the Extension Office anytime Monday-Friday from 8am-5pm (closed 12-1 for lunch). Cost is \$10 per tag.



2015-2016 Major Show Steer Validation

It is time to plan for the 2016-2017 Texas 4-H/FFA Steer Validation Program. If you are planning on showing steers at any of the major shows in Texas (Odessa, Ft. Worth, San Antonio, San Angelo, Houston, Austin, or Dallas) then you will need to order tags for validation. The deadline to order steer tags is Monday, April 18, 2016. Cost for each tag is \$10 per tag. Checks must accompany orders and should be made payable to Andrews County Junior Livestock Association (ACJLA). Since refunds cannot be given, please order the number of tags as accurately as possible. If you are unsure of the number of tags needed, order a few extra to be safe. All major livestock shows require all 4-H and FFA steers to be validated in the Texas 4-H/FFA Steer Validation Program and identified appropriately with an official Texas steer tag,



nose print, hair sample and tattoo. All Andrews County steers will be validated in June. Please note that this is only a validation of ownership. This is not an entry to a show. County and Major show entries will be made separately. If there are any questions, please call the Extension Office at 524-1421.

4-H CLUB OFFICER RESPONSIBILITIES

Presiding as a club officer requires leadership skills and commitment to the club. Each elected member will receive a <u>4-H Club Officer Handbook</u> that will give a detailed description of each position and will give samples of meeting formats and forms that are needed to have successful club meetings. Elected members will also have help from ALA Leaders and Extension Agents.

So go ahead, take a chance and run for office! GOOD LUCK!!

President: (9th-12th grade, must be in 2 or more active 4-H projects, commit to attend

<u>2/3 of all scheduled meetings</u>) preside at all club meetings using basic parliamentary procedures; remember that good club meetings should have inspiration (5-10 min– motto, pledge, song), business (15 min– roll call, minutes, committee reports), program (15-20 min– talks, demonstrations) and recreation (30 min– games, refreshments).

1st Vice President: (9th-12 grade, must be in 2 or more active 4-H projects, commit to attend 2/3 of all scheduled meetings) assist the president; preside at meetings in the absence of the president; serve as president if the president leaves the club or resigns his office; serve as a host to any guest speakers of your club meetings; introduce any guest speakers at the meeting and give some information about what the speaker will discuss.

2nd Vice President: (6th-12th grade, must be in 2 or more active 4-H projects, commit to attend 2/3 of all scheduled meetings.) assist the president and vice-president; preside at meetings in the absence of the president and vice-president; in charge of recreation planning of games.

Secretary: (6th-12th grade, must be in 2 or more active 4-H projects, commit to attend 2/3 of all scheduled meetings) call roll and check attendance; read minutes from the last meeting; keep complete and accurate minutes of all meetings; write letters for the club.

Treasurer: (6th-12th grade, must be in 2 or more active 4-H projects, commit to attend 2/3 of all scheduled meetings) give reports of the club's financial condition at each meeting; report on profits of any fundraisers the club has; keep accurate records of all receipts and expenditures of club funds.

Reporter: (6th-12th grade, must be in 2 or more active 4-H projects, commit to attend 2/3 of all scheduled meetings) submit interesting reports and pictures of club activities to local newspaper, radio and television stations; report club news to the Extension Office to be included in the 4-H newsletter.

4-H CLUB OFFICER RESPONSIBILITIES CONTINUED...

Council Delegate: (6th-12th grade; currently active in 4-H and strong desire to serve) organize radio spots to promote 4-H; attend other city wide meetings that could benefit our club and report back; make presentations about the 4-H Club at other city wide meetings.

Community Service Chair: (3rd-6th grade, active in 4-H and strong desire to serve) research community service needs for Andrews County, propose and help plan 4 community service projects to fit the needs of our community.

Health & Safety Officer: (3rd-6th grade, active in 4-H and strong desire to serve) provide a 5 minute presentation on health and/or safety at each of the 4-H meetings.

Song Leader: (3rd-12th grade; currently active in 4-H and strong desire to lead) come up with a list of songs to sing for each meeting, or a playlist of songs to play as guests arrive and during recreation; in charge of pledge and motto.

Junior Sweetheart: (3rd-5th grade) present awards to members at 4-H functions and events; represent and promote Andrews County 4-H Club at local radio station and in the community.

Intermediate Sweetheart: (6th-8th grade) present awards to members at 4-H functions and events; represent and promote Andrews County 4-H Club at local radio station and in the community.

Senior Sweetheart: (9th-12th grade) present awards to members at 4-H functions and events; represent and promote Andrews County 4-H Club at local radio station and in the community.
