

<u>District 6 4-H Species Clinic/Showmanship Clinic</u> <u>November 21st (RSVP by Nov 13th)</u>

District 6 4-H will host a Lamb/Goat/Swine training on November 21st at the Reagan County 4-H Building in Big Lake, TX. Registration will take place between 9:00am-9:30am. Anyone planning to attend must RSVP by Friday, November 13th. This training is intended to provide an educational opportunity for new or experienced 4-H families participating in a livestock project. The main purpose is to teach basic principles of livestock management as they relate to facility maintenance, selection, nutrition, animal health, handling, showmanship and transportation. Quality Assurance programs are discussed to ensure safe and legal us of drugs or medications to facilitate ethical care, development and exhibition of livestock.

OBJECTIVES:

- -Explain the importance of stock show rules and guidelines
- -Identify the six pillars of character and apply them to livestock projects.
- -Explain why quality assurance is important in livestock production.
- -Describe facilities and equipment, selection, nutrition, health management and feeding, fitting and showmanship for various species.
- -Identify and describe 4-H livestock project opportunities.
- -Identify resources.
