
Shearing and Wool Classing Schools in San Angelo

Applications are being accepted for Sheep Shearing School and Wool Classing School that will take place January 3-5, 2017 at the AgriLife Research Center in San Angelo.

Applicants must be at least 16 years of age and cost is \$150. The sheep shearing school will prepare individuals to become professional sheep shearers by providing proper animal handling techniques and proper use of professional shearing equipment and tool maintenance. The wool classing school will equip individuals with basic Texas sheep & GOAT

knowledge to properly prepare and package wool for commercial marketing. Participants will be exposed to wool objective measurement techniques, wool biology, improvement through genetic selection and proper package labeling. 


2017 Andrews County Junior Livestock Show Schedule of Events

- Wednesday, January 11, 2017 Goats, lambs, swine in ACE Arena by 3:00pm; Weigh, sift and classify starting at 4:00pm.
