General House Keeping and Reminders

Whew! It's been a very busy month! Between validations and stock show sign ups, we are full speed ahead to county and major stock shows!!

As we get closer to crunch time, we need to focus even harder and your animals weights and finish. First thing is to be sure to check your rulebook(s) for the weight limits! If you don't have the information you need contact us at the Exten-

sion Office!

For those of you who are new, you can gauge how much your animal will weight by determining how much they are gaining per day. First, weigh your animals once a week and divide the difference of those weights by 7 days... this will tell you how much their average daily gain (ADG) is. Then multiply that average daily gain (ADG) by the number of days left until the show, and add that to the

current weight! (For county, we are exactly 47 days out for weigh in!)

Example:

Week 1—145lbs ÷ Week 2—160 lbs = 2.2 lbs gained per day, 15 lbs gained a week

2.2 lbs x 47 days = 103.4 lbs 160 lbs (current weight) + 103.4 (will gain) = 263.4 lbs day of weigh in! If you have questions, contact the Extension Office!

Just a reminder for future applicants, 4-H scholarships require you to do a 4-H record book and participate a minimum of two years within your 4-H career so be sure to view these rules and guidelines!

Recordbooks will be due in the spring so if you haven't started gathering your information yet, now is the time!

Preparing for Winter

As the days get shorter and colder weather starts blowing in, it is very important to keep track of animal health and housekeeping!

Especially with swine, consider putting up heat lamps when the weather gets below 60°. You will need to adjust lamps as it gets colder by lowering the heat lamp if animals are piling on top of each other and raising it if animals are laying far out from underneath it.

Due to the inconsistency of Texas weather, it is likely that your animal may form an upper-respiratory infection over the next couple of months. Problems such as cough-

ing, sneezing and runny nose can lead to severe health issues which will cause a set back in the growth of your animal.

Along with heat lamps, you should also put down some type of bedding (i.e. straw, shavings, etc.) when the weather gets below 45°. You will want to use straw or shavings but grass hay will work as well; as long as you don't use alfalfa or other rich forage. Be sure to watch your animals as it is likely they will try to eat anything and everything you put down. Nibbling a few pieces is fine but sheep and goats may need to be muzzled if they try to eat more than just a nibble.

Be sure to carefully watch your animals! If they go off feed or have a change in behavior (other than a bit of extra-energy and playfulness on the warm days after the first cold snap) contact Amanda and the veterinarians office! Preventing health issues is important but when it happens, identifying problems early on will save you time, money and extra heart-ache.
