2017 ANDREWS COUNTY MAJOR SHOW HANDBOOK

Hello all,

We have prepared this show guide to help you with the entry process and give you a quick reference guide. While every effort has been made for it to be accurate, **each shows premium catalog/web site is official**. Please be mindful that rules and dates may change after this book has been published. If you need further clarification I will be more than happy to answer any questions. You can also find each shows premium book on each shows web site. Please familiarize yourself and family with all the rules, dates and times. The livestock program in the state of Texas is unique in terms of its size and premium money that is paid. **By signing the entry blank you are agreeing to follow the rules of that show.** Failure to obey the rules can cause the exhibitor to be banned from that show as well as others. In addition, you will be forced to forfeit all premium money. In some cases, in the past, criminal charges have been brought against families who have broken certain rules.

For all state exhibitors, you must complete the Quality Counts Verification in order to enter livestock shows. The verification process requires that 4-H and FFA exhibitors have a base knowledge of the principles of quality assurance and good moral character, and take an online Quality Counts Verification test to obtain a Verification Number. Quality Counts curriculum should be used to teach 4-H and FFA members the importance of good character and ethical behavior in caring for and exhibiting animals and prepare exhibitors for the verification test. "Texas Trail", the online delivery component of Quality Counts can be found at: <http://agrilife.org/qualitycounts/>. Exhibitors that are 13 years of age or younger must take the test designed for junior level exhibitors. Exhibitors 14 years or older must take the senior level test. Exhibitors are only required to pass the appropriate age level test one time. 4-H exhibitors that are moving into the senior age group this year must take the senior level test to meet the requirements of the verification program. In addition, the Livestock Program Ethics Policy that you signed for each species at validation has been included for you reference.

Please use this booklet to visit with your teachers about when you will be absent from school. You should work with them ahead of time so that they can have your assignments ready prior to you being absent. We will request for excused absences and check eligibility for all livestock shows, however it is up to you, the exhibitor, to inform them of your absence and take care of business.

General Rules and Regulations

Entry Rules

1. There will be a \$35.00 entry fee for each Club Steer and \$35.00 entry fee for each junior Breeding Heifer.
2. No straw or hay bedding allowed. All cattle will be bedded on washed sand.
3. Sheep and goats will be bedded on wood shavings.
4. Entry fee for the Lamb is \$25.00 and Goats will be \$25.00. No refunds of any entry fees will be made after the closing date for entries.
5. To be eligible to exhibit in the Steer, Heifer, Lamb and Goat divisions all Texas animals must be validated in accordance with the Texas validation program. Texas animals arriving at the show without the official Texas Steer, Lamb or Goat tag will not be eligible to show. The State Validation number on the official Texas Show tags must be shown on the weight card.

Junior Finewool Lamb Show

Judge – *Robert Scott*

Classifier – 3 Man Classifying System

Rules:

1. Each Exhibitor is limited to four lambs in this show. Wether lambs only may be shown. Entries having shed lamb teeth or with permanent teeth in view are not eligible to show.
2. No lambs other than fine-wool breeds will be permitted to show (Rambouillet, Delaine, Debouillet, purebred or high grade with typical body markings for the breed). No black lambs. Lambs will be classified in the show ring.
3. Cut off time for packer lambs is Saturday, January 7, 2017, 12:00 noon.
4. Lambs must be in the barn by 5:00 p.m. on January 6, 2017. Releases will be written on lambs on Saturday, January 7, 2017, after posting of the sale order in the office. Release tables will be in show barn.
5. A \$25.00 entry fee will be charged for each entry and no refunds will be made after the closing date for receiving entries. Wood shavings will be furnished.
6. Exhibitors will weigh their own lambs. Lamb weights should be turned in as soon as possible and must be turned in by 5:00 p.m. January 7, 2017.
7. There will be a 100 lb minimum. There will be a three (3) pound weigh back on the top and bottom of the class. Any lamb weighing three pounds on the top and bottom of what the lamb weighed will be disqualified. Scales will be furnished.
8. All lambs will be weighed and divided into (5) five equal classes.
9. Lambs must be shorn slick with a uniform length of fleece. Boots may be left on lambs.
10. Five lambs from each class (total 25) will be sold in the auction sale. All lambs will be sold on their class weights. **SUBSTITUTE EXHIBITORS WILL BE ALLOWED THROUGH THE SALE WITH EARLY NOTIFICATION TO THE LAMB CHAIRMAN. ANY EXHIBITOR THAT IS NOT PRESENT FOR THE SALE OR DOES NOT HAVE AN ELIGIBLE EXHIBITOR DESIGNATED TO TAKE THE LAMB THROUGH THE SALE WILL RECEIVE PACKER VALUE ONLY FOR THAT LAMB.**

Dub Day Memorial Senior Showmanship Award

Justin Powell Memorial Junior Showmanship

1. A committee will pick exhibitors during lamb judging.
2. Exhibitors selected will return with lamb to ring for placing by official Judge.
3. Awards: Junior and Senior Champion Showmanship Trophy Buckle.

Junior Market Goat Show

Judge – *Taylor Osbourn*

Rules:

1. Each exhibitor is limited to five goats of any breed or crossbreeds in this show. **Wether goats only may be shown.** Entries must have front two milk teeth in normal position with no permanent teeth showing at the time of weigh-in to be eligible to show. Goats must have been owned and cared for continuously since November 1, 2016.
2. All general rules apply to the goat show.
3. Goats may be penned beginning at 12:00 noon on Thursday January 5, 2017 and all goats must be in place by 4:30 p.m. Thursday January 7, 2017. Note: Goats arriving prior to 12:00 noon will not have access to a pen until 12:00 noon. Releases will be written after the show is completed.
4. Entry fee will be \$25.00 for each entry and no refunds will be made after the closing date for receiving entries. Initial bedding with wood shavings will be furnished, any additional bedding wanted by exhibitors will have to be purchased or supplied by exhibitors.
5. The Goat committee will be available to weigh goats beginning at **2:00 p.m.** on Thursday January 5, 2017. Note: individuals may bring their goat to the scales after 2:00 p.m., all goats from a chapter or county do not have to come together. **All goats not weighed must be in line at the scales by 4:45 p.m.** Scales will close after the last goat in line at **4:45 p.m.** has been weighed on Thursday, January 5, 2017. No goat will be re-weighed after leaving the scales any re-weigh must be requested immediately after goat has been weighed and prior to next goat in line being weighed.
6. **Goats will be checked for teeth, hair length & sharp horns at the time of weigh in.**
7. A minimum number of classes will be determined by dividing the number of entries that are weighed-in by 75. Classes will be divided by weight. There will be a 50 pound minimum and no maximum weight.
8. No paint, powder, or artificial coloring is allowed. Goats must be **uniformly** shorn to 3/8" or less above the knee and hock joints, goats may have longer hair on the end of the tail. **Shearing of goats will be allowed on the grounds, and the hair length will be checked at weigh-in.** Horns must be tipped before arrival on show grounds. No sharp points allowed.
9. **Goat show will be at 8:00 a.m. on Friday January 6, 2017,** with release after the completion of the show. Champion and Reserve Champion goat may not be released until after the rodeo on Friday January 2, and may be required to be available for a parade of Champions during the rodeo.
10. This is a **Premium Show Only.** NO goats will be sold in the auction sale. Premium money will be determined by number of entries. Minimum premiums for the following placings have been determined with other premiums to be determined after entries received.

Champion - \$1000

Reserve Champion - \$500

Class Placing premiums determined by number of entries

11. Showmanship is not sanctioned by J.M.G.S.C. A committee will select exhibitors during judging to return with their goat for showmanship placing by official judge.
12. Substitute exhibitors may be used for the following reasons:
 - More than one goat showing in the same class
 - Exhibitor is not present and is participating in another U.I.L. sponsored function
 - Exhibitor is medically unable to show, at the discretion of the Livestock Show Vice- President doctor's written verification may be required
 - Other reasons as approved prior to showing, by goat show Chairman and Livestock Show Vice- President
13. Note: Substitute exhibitors must have entered an animal in the 2017 Sandhills Livestock Show.

Junior Market Steer Show

Judge – *Brady Ragland and Jon DeClerck*

Rules:

1. There will be no limit on the number of 4-H or FFA Steers from a County or FFA Chapter.
2. All entries must be exhibited by the owners, except when an exhibitor has more than one entry in one class or cannot be present to show the animal due to a medical condition. In these cases, any other 4-H Club or Vocational agricultural student taking part in this show may exhibit these animals. Entries must include Name of exhibitor.
3. An Auction Sale will be provided for approximately 25 Junior Steers entered in the show and competing for premiums. There will be no charge for this Auction Sale. The Grand Champion steer must sell and it is optional with owners of other placing steers as to whether they sell. (Two steers limited to any exhibitor). All sale animals will be sold on their official weigh-in weights.
4. Each exhibitor is entitled to enter no more than (2) two steers. The calves must exhibit purebred horned or polled Hereford characteristics.
5. All cattle will be bedded on washed sand, no straw, hay or shavings will be allowed in the barns. Tie-outs will be available at time of entry for \$10 each.
6. There will be a \$35.00 entry fee charged for each steer. There will be no refunds on entry fees. All cattle will be bedded on washed sand. Tie-outs will be available at time of entry for \$10 each.
7. Exhibitors will be pre-stalled upon arrival and must have their steers on display during the Show at the assigned stalls. Failure to comply with this condition will disqualify the Exhibitor.
8. Arrival Time: No arrivals before Noon Wednesday, January 4, 2017. Must be in barn by 9:00 a.m., Friday, January 6, 2017. Animals will be released after sale order is posted.
9. Weights will be turned in at sift and classifying of Junior Steers beginning at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, January 6, 2017. No steer may weigh less than 850 pounds and there is no maximum weight. Three person classifying system will be utilized. No protests allowed. Horned Hereford steers will classify first followed by polled Hereford steers.
10. Steers will be divided into classes at the discretion of the superintendent in both horned Hereford and polled Hereford breeds.
11. After judging of each class is completed, all placing steers will be reweighed before leaving the ring with a 5% weigh-back. Steers remaining qualified after weigh-back will advance in placing if steers placed higher have been disqualified.
12. Exhibitors will indicate desire to sell at auction, if eligible, immediately after each class is judged. Steers to be sold out of each class will be designated by the committee. These steers will be branded before leaving the show ring. All first and second place steers will be weighed and nose printed immediately following judging of their respective class. Steers showing for Champion and Reserve Champion will indicate desire to sell after the champions are selected. Grand Champion Steer **MUST SELL**.
13. All first place steers will be drug tested. Random steer(s) may be selected.
14. Exhibitors may not move to tie-outs between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on any given day of the show. You may not tie out in West covered arena.
15. One fan will be permitted for each five steers.
16. Packer bid price will be posted immediately after judging is completed. Any steers not eligible for the Auction will be eligible to sell to the Packer. Packer steers will be received at 6:00 PM Saturday, January 7, 2017.
17. Showmanship: Any exhibitor wishing to compete in showmanship may enter the competition. Showmanship will take place after selection of Grand and Reserve Champion Steer. Exhibitors who participate will return with steer to ring for placing by Official Judge.

ANIMAL HEALTH REGULATIONS

JUNIOR DIVISION MARKET SWINE (Barrows)

A. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within the past thirty (30) days.

JUNIOR DIVISION MARKET LAMBS (Wethers)

A. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within the past thirty (30) days.

JUNIOR DIVISION STEERS

A. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within the past thirty (30) days.

JUNIOR DIVISION BREEDING BEEF CATTLE

A. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within the past thirty (30) days.

GOATS (both Open and Junior Divisions)

A. All goats entering the show grounds must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within thirty (30) days of entry.

B. Sexually intact animals must have official USDA Scrapie Eradication Program identification. For registered animals, a registration tattoo or electronic identification accompanied by reader) may be used as official identification if registration papers accompany the animal.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Entry, Stall, Pen and Grooming Chute Space Fees. The entry and stall fees include the original bedding which will be in the stall upon arrival of livestock

NOTE: The entry/stall fee or tie out fee does not guarantee the standard stall, pen or tie-out space. In divisions where entries exceed available space it may be necessary to provide less than one (1) standard stall, pen or tie-out space per animal. Fees will not be refunded under these circumstances.

2. Ground Passes. Complimentary exhibitor ground passes will be issued to **each exhibitor** on the schedule listed below. Additional exhibitor ground passes may be purchased for \$30.

3. Parking Permits. NO FREE PARKING PERMITS WILL BE ISSUED. Each exhibitor may purchase parking permits for \$40 each, limit 2 per exhibitor. **Parking Permits must be securely attached to the windshield of vehicle.** Anyone abusing or transferring these permits will forfeit same.

4. Cooking. Cooking is not allowed on the show grounds at any time other than by food concessionaires. No cookers, crock-pots, microwaves, coffee pots, warmers or other cooking utensils will be permitted

5. Registration and Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. EXHIBITORS MUST HAVE THEIR ORIGINAL REGISTRATION PAPERS AND CERTIFICATES OF VETERINARY INSPECTION AVAILABLE WITH THEIR EXHIBITS AT ALL TIMES DURING THE SHOW. Photocopies or facsimiles will not be accepted, unless specified by the association.

6. Tie Outs. Tie Outs must be reserved and paid for at the time of entry. Tie Outs will be numbered and assigned (see note on Rule 4, Page 69). **TIE OUT TIME IS 7:30 P.M.** All cattle must be in their assigned stalls between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 7:30 p.m.

SPECIAL RULES

1. Cattle Grooming Chutes and Scales. Each 4-H Club or FFA Chapter will be allowed to purchase grooming chute/scale permits by submitting a \$35 fee for each permit along with entries. Any apparatus used for a grooming chute and/or scale must be used in the stall and completely off concrete aisles. Grooming chute/scale stickers will be issued and must be placed on the upper, right hand corner at the back of the chute.

2. Exhibitions. All entries in the Junior Livestock Show must be exhibited by the owner/exhibitor, except when the exhibitor has more than one (1) entry in a class or cannot be present to show their own animal due to circumstances beyond their control. In these cases, a substitute showman may exhibit the animal provided that the substitute showman meets all Junior exhibitor criteria and is approved by the Superintendent of that department. A substitute showman **may not** exhibit animals for an owner/exhibitor participating in other events or activities (UIL competitions, school sports, etc.) or just being absent from the competition. If the

exhibitor is scholastically ineligible to participate, as determined by the respective school district, the exhibitor and their entries are ineligible for competition.

Parents, Agricultural Science Teachers, and County Agents will not be allowed in the judging arena. An animal will be disqualified from the show if it is being trimmed, fitted, or dressed by anyone other than exhibitors, County Extension Agents or Agricultural Science Teachers from the State of Texas, or other feeders or leaders within the county or school district from which the animal is entered.

3. Artificial Coloring. Any Junior animal which, when rubbed with a white cloth or glove shows residual evidence of artificial coloring, will be disqualified, with the exception of dressing on hoofs.

4. IMPORTANT ARRIVAL INFORMATION FOR JUNIOR BARROWS & STEERS

3:00 pm Monday, January 30 to 7:00 am Tuesday, January 31:

- All arriving exhibitors, animals, tack haulers, etc. will check in at Farrington Field and be directed to either Barrow or Steer arrival locations.
- Exhibitors arriving with Barrows and Steers, Steer tack or anything other than Barrows or Barrow Show items will be directed to the Steer arrival location.

7:00 am Tuesday, January 31:

- Barrow and Steer arrivals will be combined to one (1) line.

*Trinity Park **will not** be available for early arrivals.*

5. Auction Sales for Junior Show Animals. Junior Sale of Champions, Saturday, February 4 at 9:00 a.m. in the West Arena. All Junior Steer, Wether Lamb and Barrow Grand Champions, Reserve Grand Champions, Breed Champions and Reserve Breed Champions, as well as Grand Champion, Reserve Grand Champion and Division and Reserve Division Champion Wether Goats of the show must be sold through the Junior Sale of Champions. Animals designated by the Management to be sold in the auction must remain under the exhibitor's care and expense until the animal is sold. The animals must be lead into the sale ring by their owners or by another junior exhibitor approved by the Show Management. All animals which go through the sale will be sold to the highest bidder. Animals must be presented at the sale in their natural state. Decoration of a sale animal is prohibited.

- **STEERS:** All prize winning steers will be eligible for the Junior Sale of Champions, PROVIDED DESIGNATION IS MADE AS ANIMAL LEAVES THE JUDGING RING. STEERS ENTERED FOR THE AUCTION SALE WILL BE IDENTIFIED BY A JAW BRAND (F) PLACED BY A SHOW OFFICIAL IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE CLASS IS JUDGED AND BEFORE THE ANIMAL LEAVES THE JUDGING ARENA. All sifted and non-placing steers will be sold by sealed bid prior to Friday, February 3. To sell sifted and non-placing steers, the exhibitor must deliver the steer to the holding pen area in the southeast corner of the Moncrief Building at 4:00 p.m., Friday, February 3.

- **BARROWS:** All barrows must go to slaughter. Barrows other than those listed in Rule 15, will be sold by sealed bid. Sifted barrows will be sold at a price discounted at 10¢ per pound. Bonus money will be paid to prize winning barrows based on a posted schedule. Barrows will be delivered to the sale personnel immediately following the judging of each class.

- **WETHER GOATS:** All wether goats, other than those listed in Rule 15, will be sold by sealed bid. Bonus money will be paid to prize winning goats based on a posted schedule. Exhibitors who wish to sell their wether goats must deliver their animals to the designated area at 3:00 p.m., Sunday, January 29.

- **WETHER LAMBS:** All wether lambs, other than those listed in Rule 15, will be sold by sealed bid. Bonus money will be paid to prize winning lambs based on a posted schedule. Exhibitors who wish to sell their wether lambs must deliver their animals to the Sheep Arena at 3:00 p.m., Sunday, January 29.

SPECIAL RULES

- 1.** To be eligible, barrows must be validated with the Texas Swine Validation Program administered by the Texas AgriLife Extension Service and the Texas Education Agency, division of Agricultural Science and Technology. The first and second place barrow in each class will be inspected to verify that the barrow's ear notches match those recorded at the time of validation. Breed Champion and Reserve Breed Champion as well as any other barrows designated by the show management will have samples collected for DNA analysis. In the event the DNA analysis reveals there is not a positive match, the animal will be disqualified.
- 2.** Each exhibitor is entitled to enter only one (1) barrow in the Barrow Show and must have owned the barrow prior to December 1, 2016. The barrow must have been fed and cared for by the exhibitor from date of purchase.
- 3. Upon Arrival.** A representative from each County 4-H group or FFA Chapter must obtain from the Superintendent's office a packet containing their group's ear tags and weight/breed cards for their entries in this division.
- 4. Ear Tag Numbers.** All barrows must have ear tags that match barrow's entry number at the time they are presented in the show ring. Ear tags will be provided by Stock Show.
- 5. Weighing.** Exhibitors will be responsible for weighing their own barrows and must return Weight/Breed cards to Superintendents by 10:00 a.m., Wednesday, February 1 with the declared weight and breed designation. Texas Swine Validation number must also be included on Weight/Breed cards. Any entry whose Weight/Breed card is not received by this deadline will be disqualified. To be eligible to show, all barrows must weigh not less than 230 lbs. or more than 270 lbs. Weight given on Weight/Breed card will be both the show weight and the sale weight. After Weight/Breed cards are turned in, entries will be divided into weight divisions as equal in number as possible. Placing barrows and any barrow designated by the superintendents will be weighed back. Any barrow that weighs more than 10 lbs. above or below its weigh-in live weight will be disqualified.
- 6. Classifying.** Barrows will be classified at the time of judging by a three person committee. If the animal is classed out, it will be sifted. The decision of the committee will be final and protests will not be considered by Management. See Classification Guidelines.
- 7. Sale Animals.** All barrows must go to slaughter. The first, second and eighth place lamb in each class will be nose printed and the print must match the nose print taken at the time of validation. Breed Champion and Reserve Breed Champion Lambs as well as any other lambs designated by the show management will have samples collected for DNA analysis. In the event the DNA analysis reveals there is not a positive match, the animal will be disqualified.
2. **Upon arrival.** A representative from each County 4-H group or FFA Chapter must obtain from the Superintendent's office a packet containing their group's ear tags and weight/breed cards for their entries in this division.
3. **Ear Tag Numbers.** All lambs must have ear tags that match lamb's entry number at the time they are presented in the show ring. Ear tags will be provided by the Stock Show.
4. **Weighing.** Exhibitors will be responsible for weighing their own lambs and must return weight cards to Superintendent by 10:30 a.m., Friday January 27. Any entry whose weight card is not received by this deadline will be disqualified. Texas Lamb Validation number must be included on weight card. Fine Wool, Fine Wool Cross and Medium Wool lambs weighing less than 90 lbs. will not be eligible to compete. Minimum weight on Southdowns and Dorper will be 80 lbs. Scales will be provided by Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show.
5. **Classifying.** Exhibitors must indicate on weight card the breed of each entry. All lambs will be classified at the time of judging by a three-man classifying committee. **If the animal is classified out, it will be sifted.**
6. **Class Weights.** After weight cards have been returned to the Superintendent's office, entries will be divided into weight divisions, as equal in number as possible, light, medium, and heavy, for each breed. All placing lambs in each class and any lambs designated by the Superintendents will be weighed back. Any lambs not meeting minimum weight requirements, or lambs with weights more than 5 lbs. above or below the weight turned in to the Superintendent on the weight card will be disqualified. One (1) or more of the top five (5) placing groups of ten (10) will be re-weighed in their entirety, and any lamb not meeting the weight criteria stated above, will disqualify the entire group.
7. **Shearing.** All lambs must be shorn to the skin with mechanical shears one (1) week or less prior to arrival at the Show, leaving a uniform length of wool over the entire body. Boots may be left on all lambs. No electrical clippers or blocking tables will be allowed in the lamb barn. Hand shears may be used.
8. **All Champions and Reserve Champions must sell.**
9. **Number of Animals.** Each exhibitor is entitled to enter a maximum of eight (8) wether lambs in the Junior Lamb Show, but no more than two (2) will be allowed in each weight class.
10. **Artificial Coloring.** No paint, powder, or artificial coloring may be used on lambs.
11. **Sale Animals.** The Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion lambs as well as all breed champion lambs and reserve breed champions will be sold in the Junior Sale of Champions. All other sale lambs must be delivered to the Sheep Arena at 3:00 p.m., on Sunday, January 29. **A receipt must be obtained from the sale personnel on each lamb sold.**

To be eligible, steers must be validated with the Texas Steer Validation Program administered by the Texas AgriLife Extension Service and the Texas Education Agency, division of Agricultural Science and Technology. The first and second place steer in each class will be nose printed and the print must match the nose print taken at the time of validation. Breed Champion and Reserve Breed Champion as well as any other steers designated by the show management will have samples collected for DNA analysis. In the event the DNA analysis reveals there is not a positive match, the animal will be disqualified.
2. Each exhibitor is entitled to enter only one (1) steer in the Steer Show and must have owned the steer prior to July 1, 2016. The steer must have been fed and cared for by the exhibitor from date of purchase.
3. **Upon Arrival.** A representative from each County 4-H group or FFA Chapter must obtain from the Superintendent's office a packet containing their group's ear tags, Weight/Breed cards and show numbers for their entries in this division.
4. **Ear Tag Numbers.** All steers must have ear tags that match steer's entry number at the time they are presented in the show ring. Breed steers must have ear tags at time of classification. Ear tags will be provided by Stock Show.
5. **Weighing.** Exhibitors will be responsible for weighing their own steers. Texas Steer Validation number, breed and declared weight must be included on Weight/Breed cards. Weight given on Weight/Breed card will be the official weight and used as both the show weight and the sale weight. Exhibitors entering European Crossbreds and Other Breed classes must submit Weight/Breed cards to the Superintendent's office by 10:00 a.m., Wednesday, February 1. Any entry in these classes whose Weight/Breed card is not received by this deadline will be disqualified. Exhibitors entering Angus, Hereford, Polled Hereford, Shorthorn and American Breeds and Crossbred classes will submit Weight/Breed cards at the time of classifying.
6. **Classifying.** Will begin at 8:00 a.m., Wednesday, February 1 in the Watt Arena. Exhibitors of Angus, Hereford, Polled Hereford, Shorthorn and American Breeds and Crossbreds will be called to present their steers by breed to the show ring. Exhibitors will declare the breed of the steer by presenting the animal at the designated time for that breed. Any steer classified out of that breed division will not be allowed to declare an alternate breed and will be sifted out of the show. The decision of the classifiers will be final and protests will not be considered by Management.
7. All steers must have a minimum weight of 900 pounds.
8. After Weight/Breed cards are turned in, entries will be divided into weight divisions, as equal in number as possible, as specified under each breed. After the judge's placing of each class, the first and second prize winning steers, along with any other steer designated at the discretion of the Show management will be reweighed. **Any steer weighing more than 105 percent of its official weight will be disqualified.** In case of disqualification, the lower prize winning steers will remain as placed by the judge and will not be graduated up to higher positions.
9. **Fans will not be allowed in the Junior Steer Show.**
10. First prize/Division Champion steers of each classification will compete for Champion Steer of the Breed. Second prize/Reserve Division Champion steers are required to be brought into the arena. After the Champion Steer of the Breed is selected, the second prize/Reserve Division Champion steer from the class/division which furnished the Champion will compete with the First Prize/Division Champion steers in the other classes/divisions of this breed for Reserve Champion Steer.

11. All prize winning steers will be eligible for the Junior Sale of Champions, PROVIDED DESIGNATION IS MADE AS ANIMAL LEAVES THE JUDGING ARENA. STEERS ENTERED FOR THE AUCTION SALE WILL BE IDENTIFIED BY A JAW BRAND (F) PLACED BY A SHOW OFFICIAL IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE CLASS IS JUDGED AND BEFORE THE ANIMAL LEAVES THE JUDGING ARENA. All sifted and non-placing steers will be sold by sealed bid prior to Friday, February 5. To sell sifted and non-placing steers, the exhibitor must deliver the steer to the holding pen area in the southeast corner of the Moncrief Building at 4:00 p.m., Friday, February 3. **A receipt must be obtained from the sale personnel on each steer sold.**

This division is open to any breed or crossbred, any age. Wether goats are required to have horns tipped blunt prior to arrival on the show grounds. Tipping or removal of horns on the show grounds will result in disqualification.

1. To be eligible, wether goats must be validated with the Texas Wether Goat Validation Program administered by the Texas AgriLife Extension Service and the Texas Education Agency, division of Agricultural Science and Technology. First place wether goats as well as any other wether goats designated by the show management will have samples collected for DNA analysis. In the event the DNA analysis reveals there is not a positive match, the animal will be disqualified.

2. Upon Arrival. A representative from each 4-H Group or FFA Chapter must obtain from the Superintendent's office a packet containing their groups ear tags for their entries in this division.

3. Ear tags will be provided by the Stock Show and exhibitors are responsible for tagging their own animals. All goats must have ear tags that match goat's entry number at the time of weigh in.

4. Class Weight. Exhibitors will be responsible for weighing their own goats and must return weight cards to Superintendent by 12:00 noon, Friday, January 27. After weighing, goats will be divided into twelve (12) weight divisions, as equal in number as possible. Any goat not meeting fifty (50) pound minimum or goats with weights more than four (4) pounds above or below the weight turned in on the weight card will be disqualified.

5. Number of Animals. Each exhibitor is entitled to enter only one (1) wether goat.

6. Ownership. The exhibitors must have owned their goats prior to November 1, 2016 and shall have fed and cared for their goats exclusively during the period from ownership date to the date of the show.

7. Showmanship Entries. Entries in the Showmanship class are not required. However, animals exhibited in the Showmanship class must also be entered in the Junior Wether Goat Show.

8. All goats must be shorn to the skin with uniform clip above the knee and hock joints prior to arrival at the Show. No electric clippers or blocking tables will be allowed. Hand shears may be used.

9. Sale Animals. The Champion, Reserve Champion, Division and Reserve Division Champion Wether Goats will be sold in the Junior Sale of Champions. All other exhibitors desiring to sell their Wether Goats may do so by delivering their animals to the designated area. Wether Goats will be received at 3:00 p.m., Sunday, January 29. **A receipt must be obtained from the sale personnel on each wether goat delivered.**

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GENERAL RULES

1. Gate Passes: Each exhibitor will be issued one (1) free Gate Pass valid for the duration of the Livestock Show and may purchase up to five (5) more. **Gate Pass (Valid for 18 days of the Livestock Show) = \$20.00**

2. Car Passes for Junior Show Exhibitors: Each owner may purchase one car pass for each week they are showing. Livestock Exhibitor Parking will be in Lots 5 & 6.

Week #1 Car Pass (Valid Feb. 11-20) = \$27.00

Week #2 Car Pass (Valid Feb. 20-28) = \$27.00

Car Passes must be fully affixed to the windshield. Partially applied, laminated, wrapped, or taped stickers are not valid. Failure to comply will result in confiscation of Car Pass and loss of parking privileges.

3. Stalling: The Show does not charge a stall fee in barns and does not guarantee stall space to any entry. Stalls will be assigned upon arrival at the Salado Creek Staging Office with the exception of Junior Market Goats and Junior Market Lambs. Certain stalling requests in extenuating circumstances may be granted, but no other general stalling requests will be considered. No early arrivals are allowed without permission from Show Management.

4. **Fans:** No fans will be permitted in aisles at any time. Fans will be limited to one fan per five head of cattle. Fans behind cattle are **not** allowed. No fans will be permitted in the Auction Barn during the Junior Commercial Steer Show, the Morris Center, or in the Swine Barn.
5. **Cooking:** Cooking is NOT allowed on the grounds at any time. No cookers, crock-pots, microwaves, coffee pots, warmers, or any other cooking utensils are permitted on the grounds. Any cooking utensils, including coffee pots, brought onto the grounds will become property of the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo.
6. **Medication received prior to the show:** Animals under the care of a licensed veterinarian and/or taking any type of performance enhancing medication which may include, but is not limited to, steroids, diuretics, anti-inflammatories, tranquilizers and pain killers, **are ineligible for competition. Exhibitors with questions regarding medications and/or eligibility should consult with the Official San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo Veterinarian prior to competition.** In instances where an animal has been administered a drug that is FDA approved for its species, the exhibitor must be aware that the time it takes for all drug residue to completely clear the system **is generally longer than the labeled withdrawal time** for most drugs. SALE maintains a ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY for unethically fitted livestock. Adequate time must have passed so that the animal does not test positive for drugs upon arrival. Once the animals arrive on the SALE grounds, they must remain free and clear of all residues of medications, drugs, chemicals, and other substances.
7. **Medication during the Show:** The Official Show Veterinarian Office is located at the North end of Cattle Barn #2. For the convenience of exhibitors, the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo arranges to have veterinarians available; however, they do not donate their services or medications. Fees should be discussed before treatment. **All medication administered during the livestock show must be administered by the Official San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo Veterinarian** and a written medication record must be filed. Animals receiving performance enhancing drugs (including, but not limited to, steroids, diuretics, anti-inflammatories, tranquilizers and pain killers) in this manner are ineligible for competition. The Official Show Veterinarian is authorized to remove any animal from competition if the health, safety, or welfare of the animal is in question.
8. **Drug:** The term "drug" shall mean any substance for which the sale, possession, or use is controlled by license under federal, state, or local laws or regulation and any substance commonly used by the medical or veterinary professions that affects the circulatory, respiratory, muscular, skeletal or central nervous system of any species of livestock. If drugs are used by an Official Show Veterinarian to treat a recognized disease in market animals, the withdrawal times listed by the drug manufacturer will be strictly followed.

JUNIOR SHOW RULES

1. **Exhibitor Substitution:** Entries in the Junior Show must be shown by their owner. Exhibitor substitutions may be allowed under the following conditions. In all cases, the Department Superintendent must approve the exhibitor substitution and will do so only if all conditions are met. Substitute exhibitors may show only one animal, in addition to their own project, in each Junior Department.
- **Substitution A - Other School Activity:** This request must be made on the Official San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo Exhibitor Substitution Form provided by Show Management. This request must be accompanied by a statement, signed by a School Administrator, on school letterhead stating the specific reason a substitute is requested. The completed Official San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo Exhibitor Substitution Form and the statement must be submitted to the Department Superintendent prior to the start of the respective Show. Attending school does not constitute as an Other School Activity. Examples of Other School Activities are UIL events, school sports, etc.
 - **Substitution B - Sickness:** This request must be made on the Official San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo Exhibitor Substitution Form provided by Show Management. This request must be accompanied by a statement, signed by a Physician, on his/her letterhead. The completed Official San

Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo Exhibitor Substitution Form and the Physician's statement must be submitted to the Department Superintendent prior to the start of the respective Show.

- **Substitution C - More Than One Entry In A Class or the Exhibitor Has Entries In More Than One Department Showing At The Same Time:** This request must be made on the Official San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo Exhibitor Substitution Form provided by Show Management. The completed Official San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo Exhibitor Substitution Form must be submitted to the Department Superintendent prior to the start of the respective Show.
- In any of the three situations listed above, or in the case of an emergency, the Department Superintendent may use his/her own discretion as to whether a substitute showman will be allowed. If a positive decision is rendered, the substitute must be from the same school, FFA Chapter, or 4-H Club as the original exhibitor with the following two exceptions:
- The original exhibitor is the only exhibitor from that school, FFA Chapter, or 4-H Club entered in that Department.
- All other members from that school, FFA Chapter, or 4-H Club are exhibiting at the same time.
- In either case, any junior exhibitor, who is entered and exhibiting in the respective department, meeting the approval of the Department Superintendent may exhibit the animal.

2. Junior Auction Animals: All placing Market Steers, Market Lambs, Market Barrows, Market Broilers, Market Turkey Hens, and Market Goats must be sold through the Junior Auction.

3. Junior Livestock Auction Exhibitors: Exhibitors with projects eligible for the Junior Livestock Auction need to be aware that auction procedures may dictate that an exhibitor is required to walk a designated project across the auction block in place of their own project, or the exhibitor may be required to walk across the auction block without a project. The Junior Exhibitor must present his/her animal for the Auction or the animal will be sold as a no-place. Exhibitors who are unable to attend the Junior Livestock Auction may request a substitution. This request must be made on the Official San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo Auction Exhibitor Substitution Form provided by Show Management. Auction Exhibitor Substitutions must be approved by Show Management.

4. Blocking Tables & Trim Chutes: No Market Lamb or Market Goat Blocking Tables are permitted on grounds. No Steer or Junior Heifer Trim Chutes are permitted on grounds.

5. Blow Dryers: No blowers will be permitted during the Junior Market Shows.

- 2. Entry:** Entries must be submitted online and official San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo entry forms must be completed. Gilts may be double-entered in the Open Show but must have been submitted as a separate entry via online entry system.
- 3. Number Shown:** Each owner may enter a maximum of three(3) head in the Junior Breeding Swine Show
- 4. Ownership/Registration:** Animals must be registered in the Herdbook of their Association in only the name of the Junior owner on or before December 1, the year preceding the show. Purchase, delivery, possession, transfer and registration must all take place on or before December 1, the year preceding the show. Superintendents will check Original Registration Certificates at time of Check-In. Original Registration Certificates must be available at all times.
- 5. Show Check-in Procedures:** Exhibitors must check-in and complete the Junior Breeding Swine Disposition Form. Check-in for the Junior Breeding Swine show does not constitute check-in for the Open Breeding Swine Show. Upon completion, the exhibitor will be given the remaining sections of the Junior Breeding Swine Disposition Form to bring with them to the ring during judging. Once an exhibitor leaves the Check-In area, no changes to their entry will be allowed.
- 6. Fitting:** Foreign material including (but not limited to) painting, powdering, oiling, artificial coloring, or adhesives is prohibited. No clippers which require an electrical current are allowed to be used on Junior Breeding Swine once they arrive on the grounds. Cordless clippers are allowed, however, restraining the animal for clipping purposes is prohibited. Failure to comply with this rule will result in disqualification.
- 7. Judging:** Overall Supreme Champion & Reserve Supreme Champion Gilt will be judged at the conclusion of the Show. All Breed Champions and Reserve Breed Champions must participate in the Supreme Champion Gilt Drive or be subject to disqualification.
- 8. Age:** All gilts must have been farrowed between July 1 and September 10, 2016 inclusive.
- 9 Classes:** Classes within each breed will be broken by age following Check-In. There will be 42 classes of gilts (excluding champion classes). The number of classes per breed will be determined following check-in and based upon the percentage of that breed to the total number of gilts in the show. Gate Passes:** Each exhibitor will be issued one (1) free Gate Pass valid for the duration of the Livestock Show and may purchase additional passes in advance or at the gate. **Gate Pass** (Valid for duration of Livestock Show) \$10.00 Starting February 1, all passes (Season Passes) will be available for \$20.00
- 2. Car Passes:** Exhibitors and Supervisors will be eligible to purchase Car Passes good for the duration of the show. Car passes must be fully affixed to the windshield of the vehicle. Partially applied, laminated, wrapped or taped stickers are not valid. Failure to comply will result in confiscation of Car Pass and loss of parking privileges. These passes allow access to parking lots at Gate 4. **Car Pass** (Valid for duration of Livestock Show) \$20.00
- 3. Stalling:** All stalls will be assigned upon arrival. Sheep, Goat and Swine stalls assignments will be made at Gate 2. Cattle stalls assignments will be made at the Stall Office in the Cattle Barn which requires entry at Gate 6 off Lake View Heroes Drive (formerly 50th Street).
- 4. Equipment:**
 - Scales:** Exhibitors will not be allowed to bring portable scales in the Auto Wrangler Livestock Barn. Scales will be provided by the show in all barns; such scales are unofficial and are provided for exhibitors' convenience only.
 - Fans:** Fans are not permitted in the Auto Wrangler Livestock Barn (Sheep, Goat and Swine barn), unless the temperature exceeds 90 degrees Fahrenheit. Announcements will be made regarding this.
 - Generators:** Generators are not allowed.
 - Heat Lamps/Propane Heaters:** Heat lamps and propane heaters are not allowed in the barn.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOW RULES

Rules: All general rules apply to all shows within this division, as do the rules stated in the Junior Show Specific Rules and Regulations section and the specific show pages. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to know and understand each and all of the rules applicable to them and their exhibits.

- 1. Eligibility:** The term "exhibitor" shall mean the bonafide owner of the project. To be eligible to compete in the Junior Show exhibitors must: Reside and attend school in Texas; Be a bonafide member of a Texas 4-H Club or FFA Chapter, who have continuously owned and personally fed and cared for their animals under the direct supervision of a CEA or AST; Be enrolled and attend a public, private or home school elementary or

secondary school in Texas; Be between the ages of 9 and 18 on or before August 31, 2016, or 8 years old and in the third grade

2. To be eligible in the Junior Livestock Show exhibitors must be Texas residents, members of a Texas 4-H Club or FFA Chapter and enrolled, and attending, public, private or home school elementary or secondary schools. Exhibitors must have continuously owned and personally fed and cared for their animals under the direct supervision of a CEA or AST. Exhibitors must be between the ages of 9 and 18 on or before August 31, 2016 or 8 years old and in the third grade.

3. **Scholastic Eligibility:** All 4-H and FFA members are considered to be eligible by the San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo for participation in the Junior Livestock Show at the time entry applications are received from the AST/CEA. Any AST/CEA who has a member that becomes ineligible to participate, for any reason, must provide written and signed notification to Show Management at least 24 hours prior to any Junior Show activity in which the ineligible exhibitor is to participate. If an exhibitor is ineligible, then the entry is ineligible.

4. **Substitute Exhibitors:** All entries in the Junior Show must be exhibited and sold by the owners. Exception: A substitute exhibitor will be allowed to show in place of the owner under the following circumstances: When an exhibitor has more than one entry in one class or another entry in the Junior Show and cannot be present; When an exhibitor is ill or injured. (Must be accompanied by a doctor's note); Approved school activity or TAKS testing (Must be accompanied by a statement from a school official on official school letterhead)

The substitute must be an eligible Junior exhibitor from the same 4-H Club or FFA Chapter entered in the show. Parents, teachers, extension agents or other adults will not be allowed to show. Substitutions are not allowed for academic ineligibility.

5. **Terminal Shows:** This is a terminal show for market lambs, market barrows, wether goats and steers placing 1st or 2nd. All market lambs, market barrows, wether goats and 1st and 2nd place steers must go to the market. Non-placing steers may be sold at the market price or they may be released.

6. **Bedding:** Bedding is included with stalls. Any and all additional bedding must be purchased from Show Management. No outside shavings will be allowed. Straw will be allowed in for cattle tie-outs only.

7. **Weighing:** Market steer, barrow, lamb and wether goat exhibitors will turn in their official show weight. The management reserves the right to weigh-back any animal at any time. Animals not weighing within the defined range set forth by the specific show rules are subject to a \$10.00/cwt fee.

8. **Health Papers:** Health papers are not required for junior market animals; however, they are required for all breeding animals and will be checked at the gate of entry.

OPEN & JUNIOR BREEDING GOATS (Texas & Out of State Origin) & Junior Angora Wether Goats

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current within thirty (30) days.

2. Sexually intact animals must have official USDA Scrapie Eradication Program Identification.

Registered animals may use a registration tattoo or electronic identification (accompanied by reader) "as official identification"; as long as registration papers accompany the animal with the Scrapie Premise ID number.

TEXAS ORIGIN SHEEP (*Jr. Breeding Sheep, Open Breeding Sheep, Ewe Lambs*)

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within the past thirty (30) days.

2. Sexually intact animals must have official USDA Scrapie Eradication Program Identification.

JUNIOR BREEDING GILTS

1. All certificates must be issued on or after January 20, 2017, with the following information:

A. Leptospirosis vaccination is required on breeding swine, 6 months of age and older, within 30 days prior to date of the sale (on or after January 20, 2017) with vaccine containing the following strains: Canicola, Hardjo, Icterohaemorrhagiae, Grippotyphosa, and Pomona. Vaccination date must appear on the health certificate.

B. A statement must appear that says the animal has not been fed garbage, has not been exposed to hog cholera or pseudorabies, does not originate from a quarantined herd, nor has the herd of origin had PRV within the last six months, nor have the entries themselves been vaccinated for PRV.

GENERAL RULES

1. Attention: Use of Drugs - The use by non-veterinarians* of animal drugs or other substances in any manner other than in accord with the labeling approved by FDA is a violation of federal law. Exhibitor and exhibitor's parents and/or guardians agree that: (1) they are absolutely and completely responsible persons for the care and custody of their animals, (2) the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo shall be entitled to disqualify an exhibitor whose animal tests positive for any drug, even if the exhibitor and the exhibitor's parents or guardians are innocent of any wrongdoing and did not administer the drug, (3) the drug test results of the testing laboratories are final and binding upon the exhibitor and the exhibitor's parents and/or guardians. Even if the source of the drug is unknown, the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo shall be entitled to disqualify the exhibitor. *Abuse of the extra-label privilege by veterinarians is unethical and is subject to serious consequences such as license revocation.

2. Entry Fees: Paid entry fees do not guarantee stall space for cattle. An additional \$2 drug testing fee has been assessed to each of the junior market show entry fees.

3. Grounds Passes – Each exhibitor receives on complementary pass.

4. Parking Permits – vehicle permits will be based on the number of exhibitors/county or chapter/week.

5. Admission Passes - FunPasses! are available in advance or upon arrival. Reliant Park Admission tickets are available only upon arrival.

- Admission: Daily – Adults \$ 10
- Daily – Children (3 - 12) \$ 5
- Daily – Children (2 and younger) Free
- FunPass (Season Pass) \$ 25

6. Entry Numbers: Each entry will be assigned a number. Exhibitors will receive corresponding cards with numbers which must be displayed by exhibitors during judging.

7. Scales: The Show will provide scales for the use of junior market exhibitors. Exhibitors are allowed to bring portable scales into the building if they are pad type scales with no sides and they are kept in the stall area. Any violation of this rule will cause scales to be confiscated.

8. Trim Chutes: No trim chutes are allowed on grounds during Junior Show.

9. Unethical Fitting: Unethical fitting means any attempt to alter the natural appearance, conformation, musculature or weight of an animal by any unnatural means. Animals showing any signs of being unethically fitted will be disqualified.

Examples of unethical fitting include, but are not limited to the following:

- application of any substance to any part of the animal's body, unless specifically allowed in the department rules of that species; injection, drenching or application of any substance per rectum is prohibited
- use of injections
- draining of fluids
- bruising
- feeding of material not conducive to the health of the animal, safety of food or marketability of its carcass
- surgical alterations
- artificially filling animals by stomach pumping or airing injections
- alternative treatments including but not limited to: Acupuncture, Message Therapy

10. Animal Handling Devices: Halters containing cable or pronged chains will strictly prohibited for use in all shows.

11. Exhibitor Camping: Lawn chairs that are reclining, zero gravity, or can be extended past the knee while sitting in the chair are prohibited from being used.

12. Dogs: Dogs are not allowed on Show grounds. This rule will be strictly enforced and applies to all exhibitors and their employees as well as Show visitors. Exceptions are granted for dogs that are individually trained to do work or perform tasks for a person with a disability. The task(s) performed by the dog must be directly related to the person's disability. Exceptions are also granted for dogs under contract with the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo for demonstration and entertainment purposes, and dogs entered in the Sheepdog Trials.

JUNIOR SHOW RULES

1. Maximum Number of Entries: For each individual junior exhibitor within the 4-H Club or FFA Chapter, the CEAs and ASTs may enter a maximum of the following animals in the Junior Shows:

- 1 Market Steer
- 1 Market Barrow
- 1 Market Lamb
- 1 Market Wether Goat

The use of 4-H membership and FFA membership to attempt to enter more than the maximum number of entries per junior exhibitor in each department will result in disqualification of each individual junior exhibitor involved.

2. Substitute Exhibitor: Junior Show animals must be exhibited and sold by its owner. EXCEPTION: A substitute exhibitor may be used under the following conditions:

- When an exhibitor has more than one entry in the Junior Show and cannot be present to show their animal in another department
- When an exhibitor is sick (**must be accompanied by a signed statement from a doctor**)
- Approved school activities, STAAR test, etc. (**must be accompanied by a signed statement from a school official on school letterhead**)

When one of the above conditions exists, the department superintendent may decide whether a substitute showman will be allowed. If a substitute is allowed by the department superintendent, the substitute showman must be from the same county as the original exhibitor. The substitute exhibitor also must meet all requirements of a Junior Livestock Show exhibitor. If only one exhibitor is present from a county, the department superintendent can approve a substitute from another county. An exhibitor may be used as a substitute only one time per department. Any exhibitor of a past grand champion in a respective junior market animal department is **NOT** eligible to serve as a substitute exhibitor. An official substitute exhibitor form must be filled out and turned in to department superintendent until closing of check-in. The department superintendent may also require positive identification of the substitute.

3. Stall Space: Animals entered in the Junior Livestock Show must be stalled or penned in the special divisions set aside for this purpose. Stall space is not guaranteed for each entry fee paid in the cattle shows.

4. Stalling Upon Arrival: Steers, Heifers and Barrows are stalled upon arrival. To pen together at Houston, groups **MUST** arrive and remain in line together at Airport Blvd. No assignments will be made for animals in trailers or vehicles that are coming later. Animals will be counted on the trailers or vehicles. For heifers and steers, stalls on the North side of the barn (rows nearest to the dock and wash racks) will be assigned to those exhibitors arriving first. Please see special rules of each specie for staging times.

5. Pre-Stalling: Junior Market Lambs and Goats are pre-stalled. CEAs and ASTs must complete the pre-stalling request form.

6. Drenching: Drench guns may not be used in any stall/pen, aisle or walkway. Stomach pumping, drench tubes or any other method (by esophagus) is prohibited.

7. Drug Testing: During the collection of urine and fecal samples, the Exhibitor and designated responsible adult must be present at all times unless a substitute exhibitor is approved by the superintendent. Exhibitors found in violation of this rule are subject to disqualification.

SPECIAL RULES

- 1. Stalling:** To stall together at Houston, groups **MUST** arrive together **at Airport Blvd.** NO assignments will be made for steers that are coming later. Steers will be counted on the trailers. **The Airport Boulevard staging area will remain open beginning on Sunday, March 19 at 5 p.m. for trailers to be staged.** The first three rows of cattle stalls on the north side of the barn (rows nearest to the dock and wash racks) will be assigned to those exhibitors arriving first.
- 2. Weight:** Steers must weigh a minimum 1,000 pounds.
 - Exhibitors must declare animal weight and breed at the time they Sift and Classify. The weight listed on the Weight and Breed Declaration Card will become that animal's official declared weight to be used for weigh back and selling purposes. Exhibitors must complete the Weight and Breed Declaration Card to include declared weight, state validation tag number, and breed designation.
 - After judging of each class is completed, all placing steers will be weighed before leaving the ring. Any steer weighing less than 95 percent or more than 105 percent of its official declared weight will be disqualified. Steers showing more than normal fill, as determined at weighing time, will be sifted.
- 3. Ear Tags:** Steers must have a Texas State Validation ear tag. Only validation tags will be allowed. All other tags must be removed prior to arrival. If an animal is missing the Texas State Validation ear tag upon arrival, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to notify the Superintendent immediately upon arrival.
- 4. Exhibitor Back Numbers:** During judging, exhibitors must wear the correct back number corresponding with the Show entry number.
- 5. Clipping:** Prior to arrival at the Show, steers must be pre-clipped to no more than 1/4" of hair on any part of the body, except the tail switch, (the tail switch being no more than 12" above the end of the cartilage of the tail) which may be ratted and balled or may be bobbed off. Only Scissors or cordless clippers may be used for touch-up prior to entering the show staging area for classification. Once a steer enters the classification area, they cannot leave until the classification process is complete. Steers will be checked for hair length at the time of classification. Steers found in violation of this rule will be eliminated and removed. The exhibitor will be eliminated from competition for the current show in the steer division. **1/4" hair requirement is strictly enforced.** Steers that leave the classification area will not be re-evaluated for hair length.

- 6. Trim Chutes:** No trim chutes will be allowed on the show grounds during the Junior Show.
- 7. Grooming Material:** No grooming material of any kind is allowed.
- 8. Drench Guns:** Drench guns may not be used in any stall/pen, aisle or walkway. Stomach pumping, drenching tubes or any other method (by esophagus) is prohibited.
- 9. Classification:** The exhibitor must declare the breed to be entered on the Weight and Breed Declaration Card; however, final determination of breed classification will be made by classifiers appointed by the Show Management. Breed determination is based on visible steer characteristics only; there will be no registration papers, steer certificates or steer affidavits considered. There will be no breed changes at the time of judging. Any steer reporting for a class other than the class determined by official breed classification and declared weight will not be allowed to show. Upon exiting the main cattle arena, exhibitors will receive a printed receipt including their determined breed, declared weight, and animal identification. Once classes are posted, exhibitors will have two hours to report any incorrect information that is displayed to the show superintendent or show management. The judgment of the sifting committee and classifiers is final and not subject to protest. **NOTE:** New for 2017, A Black Cross, Red Cross, and Other Cross Division have been added to the official breed classification system. However, the show will no longer provide a Chianina and AOB Division in the Junior Market Steer Show.
- 10. Placing Steers:** The top 4 steers from each class will walk through the auction ring and will be taken to Reliant Arena at an appointed time by show management. All other placing steers must be received by the commission agency by 5 p.m. on the respective day of show. The exhibitor will be responsible for their project until the animal is received by the commission agency.
- 11. Non-Placing Steers:** Exhibitors of non-placing steers have the option to sell their animals through the commission agent, but are responsible for all fees involved.

(other lambs), will be disqualified. While inside the judging arena, lambs shall not be filled or altered in any way.

c. First and second place class winners will be re-weighed prior to Breed Champion drives. Should a first or second place winner weigh out at this time, the animal will retain its placing but will be ineligible to compete for Breed Champion. If the first place class winner weighs out, the second place class winner will then advance to compete for Breed Champion honors. No other lambs will advance.

2. Top 324: Only wethers may be shown. Each breed will be divided into three weight groups for prejudging (with the exception of two groups for Dorpers). A judge will select the top 324 lambs for premium sale. A distribution of numbers to compete for the 324 sale places are:

5. Clipping: Lambs must be slick shorn and of uniform length from knee and hock up at time of arrival. There will be no shearing allowed on show grounds. Only hand shearers and cordless clippers may be used for touch ups

6. Scales: Exhibitors are not allowed to bring portable scales into the building. Scales for weighing are furnished

7. Equipment: All feed, tack, and equipment must be stored above pens.

8. Grooming: No grooming materials are allowed.

9. Unethical Fitting: Per rule 30.a. of the Junior Show Rules and Regulations, unethical fitting means any attempt to alter the natural appearance, conformation, musculature or weight of an animal by any unnatural means. 12. Bedding: In an effort to free up pen space, outside shavings are prohibited. **Junior Market Lamb exhibitors are NOT allowed to bring in outside shavings.** Sawdust will be provided free of charge. Exhibitors wishing to purchase bagged shavings will be required to do so from the Show for \$11 per bag upon arrival to Airport Blvd. Shavings will be distributed upon arrival to NRG Center. This rule will be strictly enforced.

13. Classification: Breed classification will be submitted to the kiosk self-check-in which must be completed by 1:30 p.m. on March 15, 2017. - First and second place class winners will be re-weighed prior to Division Champion drives. Should a first or second place winner weigh out at this time, the animal will retain its placing but will be ineligible to compete for Division Champion. If the first place class winner weighs out, the second place class winner will then advance to compete for Division Champion honors. No other goats will advance.

2. Top 168: Only wethers may be shown. Goats will be divided into twelve classes. The top 14 goats in each class will qualify for sale.

3. Ear Tags: State validation tags will be used for 2017. Only validation tags will be allowed. All other tags must be removed prior to arrival.

4. Exhibitor Back Numbers: During judging, exhibitors must wear the correct back number corresponding with the Show entry number.

5. Horns: If horned, the horns must be tipped (not less than the diameter of a dime at the end).

6. Clipping: Goats must be slick shorn and of **uniform** length from the knee and hock up prior to arrival. "Blocking" or fitting in an attempt to alter or enhance a goats appearance is not allowed. There will be no shearing allowed on show grounds. Only hand shearers and cordless clippers may be used for touch ups.

7. Scales: Exhibitors are not allowed to bring portable scales into the building. Scales for weighing are furnished

8. Equipment: All feed, tack, and equipment must be stored above pens. No tables or blow dryers allowed.

9. Grooming: No grooming materials are allowed.

10. Unethical Fitting: Per rule 30.a. of the Junior Show Rules and Regulations, unethical fitting means any attempt to alter the natural appearance, conformation, musculature or weight of an animal by any unnatural means. Unethical fitting includes the application of any substance to any part of the animal's body, unless specifically allowed in the department rules of that species. Injection, drenching or application of any substance per rectum is prohibited. Further, the application of any substance to or near the tail or anus is

prohibited. Animals showing any signs of being unethically fitted will be disqualified and exhibitors may forfeit all rights and privileges to exhibit livestock in the future at the Show.

11. Drench Guns: Drench guns may not be used in any stall/pen, aisle or walkway. Stomach pumping, drenching tubes, or any other method (by esophagus) is prohibited.

SPECIAL RULES

1. Weight: Barrows not weighing between **240** and **280** pounds will be sifted. Show management reserves the right to verify weight on any barrow while on Show grounds.

- Exhibitors must have completed check-in by 1:30 p.m. the day of move-in. The weight submitted at check-in will become that animal's official declared weight to be used for weigh back and official selling purposes.
- All barrows selected by the judge will be weighed before re-entering the arena. Barrows with weights more than 10 pounds below the official declared weight will be disqualified, sold on re-weigh weight, and a \$20 handling fee will be deducted from the floor check.
- Any barrow that weighs more than **10 pounds** above its official declared weight will be disqualified.

- d) First and second place or Division and Reserve Division Champions will be re-weighed prior to Division Champion and Breed Champion drives. Should a first place or Division Champion animal weigh out at this time, the animal will retain its placing but will be ineligible to compete for Breed or Division Champion. The second place or Division Reserve Champion will then advance to compete for Division or Breed Champion honors. No other barrows will advance.

2. Stalling: To pen together at Houston, groups must arrive together **at the Airport Boulevard staging area**. No assignments will be made for barrows that are coming later. Pigs will be counted on the trailers. **The Airport Boulevard staging area will remain open on Friday, March 17th and Monday, March 20th beginning at 5 p.m. for trailers to be staged.**

3. Ear Tags: State Validation tags will be used for 2017. Only validation tags will be allowed. All other tags must be removed prior to arrival.

4. Validation: Barrows must be validated in the Texas 4-H and FFA Swine Validation Program. Show Management will make the final decision regarding any potential disqualification. Animals that need to be retagged may do so between 8 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. on Saturday, March 18th and Tuesday, March 21st in the East Arena of NRG Center.

5. Exhibitor Back Numbers: During judging, exhibitors must wear the correct back number corresponding with the Show entry number.

6. Scales: Scales will be provided throughout the barn. No other scales are allowed.

7. Grooming: Only water may be applied to market barrows. No other grooming materials are allowed.

8. Health Certificate: None required for the 2017 Junior Market Barrow Show.

9. Drench Guns: Drench guns may not be used in any stall/pen, aisle or walkway. Stomach pumping, drenching tubes, or any other method (by esophagus) is prohibited.

10. Bedding: In an effort to free up pen space, outside shavings are prohibited. **Junior Market Barrow exhibitors are NOT allowed to bring in outside shavings.** Sawdust will be provided free of charge.

Exhibitors wishing to purchase bagged shavings will be required to do so from the Show for \$11 per bag upon arrival to Airport Blvd. Shavings will be distributed upon arrival to Reliant Center. This rule will be strictly enforced.

11. Driving Instruments: Driving instruments are to be used for the purpose of directing barrows while they are in transit throughout the barn and while they are being exhibited in the show ring. Exhibitors are to treat animals in a humane manner at all times and Show Management will provide a warning to any exhibitor deemed to be in violation of this basic principle of animal husbandry. Any exhibitor who fails to heed the warning will be disqualified and removed from Show grounds.

12. Classification: Breed classification will be submitted to the self check-in which must be completed by 1:30 p.m. on the day of move-in. The breed must be declared upon check-in; however, final determination of breed classification will be made by classifiers appointed by the Show Management.

13. Classifiers: Classifiers will classify Junior Market barrows at show. Sifted and non-placing barrows will be taken directly to the commissioning company.

14. Terminal Show: All barrows arriving must be sold, including sifted, non-placing and ribbon-winning barrows, according to the Show procedure.

1. Scales: Scales will be provided by the Show. Electronic load bar scales for cattle are permitted in designated locations pending approval of the Superintendent.

2. Tie-Outs: Tie-out spaces may be purchased upon arrival on a first-come, first-serve basis at the Howdy trailer or the Livestock Office for \$20.00 per tie-out. Tie-outs are not sold prior to arrival.

3. Passes: Passes will be mailed to Junior Livestock Show Exhibitors.

- **Season Gate Passes:** Each owner will be issued one (1) free Gate Pass valid for the duration of the Show and may purchase additional passes. CEAs and ASTs who are supervising projects will be issued one (1) free Gate Pass valid for the duration of the Show.

Season Gate Pass (Valid for 15 days of the Show) \$25.00

- **Car Passes:** Each owner will be eligible to purchase a car pass. Car Passes must be fully affixed to the windshield. Partially applied, laminated, wrapped or taped stickers are not valid. Failure to comply will result in confiscation of car pass and loss of parking privileges.

4. Parking: Livestock Exhibitors must enter through Gate #1 Livestock Entrance on Decker Lake Road, Austin, Texas 78724. Trailers must park at the off-site trailer parking, located at 4601 Pecan Brook Dr.

5. Sifting/Classifying Committees: Rodeo Austin will appoint Sifters and Classifiers to inspect animals. Exhibitors must remove blankets from animals at inspection. Animals judged unworthy must be removed. Decisions of the Sifters and/or Classifiers will be final and protests will not be considered. Interference with Sifters and/or Classifiers will not be tolerated. Exhibitors and others are requested not to question their decisions, and to do so may disqualify the Exhibitor concerned.

6. Animal Health Requirements: Health Papers are NOT required for Junior Market Animals.

7. Livestock Stalling: In so far as possible, shelter will be provided for livestock. The Show does not charge a stall fee in barns and does not guarantee stall space to any entry. Individual shows may charge a stall fee. Stalls will be assigned upon arrival. Special stalling requests will NOT be considered. Stalling will be done on a first come, first serve basis. Exhibitors must arrive together to stall together. Early arrivals will not be permitted on to the Show Grounds until the designated arrival time.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOW SPECIAL RULES

1. Ineligible Exhibitor: Junior Exhibitors and Participants suspended under **Texas Education Code 33.081** “No Pass, No Play” are ineligible to participate in any Rodeo Austin Junior activity, event or competition. Any animal owned by an ineligible Exhibitor is ineligible for competition.

2. Exhibitor Substitution: Entries in the Junior Livestock Show must be shown by their owner. Exhibitor substitutions may be allowed under the following conditions. In all cases, the Department Superintendent must approve the Exhibitor substitution and will do so only if all conditions are met. Substitute Exhibitors may show only one animal, in addition to their own project, in each Junior Market Department.

Type A — Other School Activity: This substitution request must be made in writing by the AST/CEA, parent or leader upon arrival at the Show. This request must be made on the official Rodeo Austin Exhibitor Substitution Form provided by the Department Superintendent. This request must be accompanied by a notarized statement, signed by a School Administrator, on school letterhead stating the specific reason a substitute is requested. The completed official Rodeo Austin Exhibitor Substitution Form and the notarized statement must be returned to the Department Superintendent prior to the start of the respective Show.

Type B — Sickness: This substitution request must be made in writing by the AST/CEA, parent or leader upon arrival at the Show. This request must be made on the official Rodeo Austin Exhibitor Substitution Form provided by the Department Superintendent. This request must be accompanied by a statement, signed by a physician, on his/her letterhead. The completed official Rodeo Austin Exhibitor Substitution Form and the physician's statement must be returned to the Department Superintendent prior to the start of the respective Show.

Type C — More than one entry in a class or the Exhibitor has entries in more than one department showing at the same time: This substitution request must be made in writing by the AST/CEA, parent or leader upon arrival at the Show or as soon as the problem arises, but in any case no later than the start of the respective Show. This request must be made on the official Rodeo Austin Exhibitor Substitution Form provided by the Department Superintendent. The completed official Rodeo Austin Exhibitor Substitution Form must be returned to the Department Superintendent prior to the start of the respective Show.

In any of the three (3) situations listed above, or in the case of an emergency, the Department Superintendent may use his/her own discretion as to whether a substitute showman will be allowed. If a positive decision is rendered, the substitute must be from the same school, FFA Chapter or 4-H Club as the original Exhibitor with the following two (2) exceptions.

- a) The original Exhibitor is the only Exhibitor from that school, FFA Chapter or 4-H Club entered in that Department.
- b) All other members from that school, FFA Chapter, or 4-H Club are exhibiting at the same time.

3. Stalling: Stalling will be assigned on a first-come, first-serve basis; animals must arrive together to be stalled together. FFA Chapters and/or 4-H Clubs wishing to be stalled together must arrive together.

4. Weighing: Barrows, steers, lambs and goats will be required to have a weight submitted by the Exhibitor to the Department Superintendent. This will be the official weight. Re-weighs are NOT permitted. The management reserves the right to weigh-back any animal at any time.

5. Youth Auction Animals: All placing market steers, lambs, barrows and goats must be sold through the Youth Auction. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion animals are required to be displayed for the duration of the Show under the care of the Exhibitor. The Youth Auction is limited to placing animals.

6. Terminal Shows: This is a terminal Show for lambs, barrows, goats and all placing steers. All lambs, barrows, goats and all placing steers brought onto the Show Grounds must go to market. Non-placing steers have the option to sell at market price or be released to Exhibitors.

7. Blocking Tables and Trim Chutes: No sheep blocking tables, goat blocking tables, or cattle trim chutes are permitted on Show Grounds during the Junior Livestock Show.

8. Fans: Fans will be limited to one (1) fan per three (3) head of cattle and one (1) fan per five (5) head of sheep, goats or hogs exhibited. No fans will be permitted in aisles during the Show.

9. Scales: Exhibitors will NOT be allowed to bring portable scales into the Show Barn. Scales will be provided by the Show. Electronic load bar scales for cattle are permitted in designated locations pending approval of the Department Superintendent.

10. Clipping: No electrical clippers are permitted on the grounds. Battery-powered clippers are allowed.

11. Blow Dryers: No blow dryers will be permitted during the junior market shows.

The decision of the Superintendent will be final.

Should a steer weigh less than 5% of the declared weight, Show Management reserves the right to use the actual weight determined at weigh-back.

Only the owner or an official substitute Junior Exhibitor may present steers for classification; adults will NOT be allowed in the arena. This will be strictly enforced. No papers will be required for any breed. Steer must meet the requirements for his breed. Steers will be visually classified by a three-member committee. Exhibitors will have one chance to classify into a breed. If a steer is classed out, the steer will proceed to ABC, AOB Black and AOB Other Color divisions for classification. Crossbred class options, including ABC, and AOB Black and AOB Other Color, may be entered at time of check-in; additionally, steers may be reclassified into these divisions at the discretion of official classifiers. All steers classified out of the Brahman division will proceed to the ABC reclassification. All steers classified out of the ABC classification must come back to the arena during the AOB Black and AOB Other Color classification for review. All other steers classified out of their respected breed will proceed to the AOB Black and AOB Other Color classification, with the exception of Brahman, which proceed to ABC first.

9. Sale Declaration: Any Exhibitor wishing to sell their steer through the floor market established by the Show must declare their intent to sell on the Livestock Office Copy of the disposition form at time of check-in. If the Exhibitor has not declared the steer for sale by the end of the check-in process and the steer does not receive one of the Youth Auction sale lots, the steer will be required to release with the Exhibitor during the designated release time.

10. Fitting: Steers which show evidence of artificial coloring with the exception of hoof dressing on hooves will be sifted. No electrical clippers will be allowed on the Show Grounds. Battery-operated clippers are allowed. Failure to comply with this rule will result in disqualification.

8. **Scales:** Exhibitors are not allowed to bring portable scales into the buildings. Scales for weighing are furnished.
9. **Class Weigh Back:** 1st and 2nd place goats in each class, as well as random animals chosen at the judge's discretion, will be weighed back at judging. Goats that weigh more than 4 lbs. above the weigh-in weight will be disqualified.
10. **Fitting:** No painting, powdering, artificial coloring or adhesives are allowed. Failure to comply with this rule will result in disqualification. Injection, drenching or application of any substance per rectum is prohibited. Further, the application of any substance to or near the tail or anus is prohibited.
11. **Placing Market Goats:** All placing Market Goats will sell in the Youth Auction. A total of 90 Market Goats will sell in the Youth Auction.
12. **Blocking / Trim Tables:** No blocking /trim tables will be permitted on the Show Grounds.
13. **Clipping:** No electrical clippers will be allowed on the grounds. Battery-operated clippers are allowed for touch-ups only. Failure to comply with this rule will result in disqualification.
14. **Blow Dryers:** No blow dryers will be allowed on the Show Grounds.

SPECIAL RULES

- 1. Entry:** Each Exhibitor may enter one (1) barrow. Entry is open to the state of Texas.
- 2. Stalling:** Stalling will be assigned on a first-come, first-serve basis; animals must arrive together to be stalled together. FFA Chapters and/or 4-H Clubs wishing to be stalled together must arrive together.
- 3. Weight Cards:** The Self-Check-In process is subject to change. Weight cards will be distributed at Howdy during stall assignment. All four copies must be completed. The information must be identical to the information entered into the kiosk during Self-Check-In. Should there be a discrepancy, the information entered into the kiosk will prevail.
 - Show Office Copy – Must be turned in by 2 p.m. to the Show Office
 - Superintendent Copy – Must be turned in at classification
 - Market Copy – Must be turned in at shipping location
 - Exhibitor Copy – Must be retained by Exhibitor (in addition to Show Kiosk confirmation receipt)
- Self-Check-In:** Exhibitors will be responsible for checking in their entry at kiosks located in front of the Show Office. To check-in, Exhibitors will scan the independent barcode located on the weight card. The Exhibitor will be prompted to enter information from the weight card including weight, breed, etc. Check-in must be completed by **Monday, March 20 at 1 p.m. at the kiosk**, or Exhibitor will not be permitted to show. After completing Self-Check-In, the kiosk will generate a confirmation receipt. It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to ensure that all information on the receipt is correct. Show Management will assist with changes in the case of user error, but changes will not be made after 1 p.m. Exhibitors should retain their confirmation receipt throughout the Show.
- 4. Show Weights:** All Exhibitors will turn in the official Show Weight for their barrow. Show Weights will range from 240 to 280 lbs. All barrows with weights turned in outside of this range, will be sifted. Weight changes will not be allowed once the individual leaves the Self-Check-In area.
- 5. Classification:** Breed must be declared at check-in. Barrows will be subject to reclassification by a three-member classifying committee. Any barrow classified out of their respective breed must come back to the arena during the Crossbred Breed Show, within their appropriate weight class for judging. See Barrow Classification Standards. Barrows will be divided into the following breed divisions: Duroc, Hampshire, Yorkshire, O.P.B.-White, O.P.B.-Dark and Crossbred.
- 6. Fitting:** The use of talc, oils or any foreign material is prohibited. No electrical clippers will be allowed. Battery-powered clippers are allowed. Failure to comply with this rule will result in disqualification.
- 7. Placing Barrows:** All placing barrows will sell in the Youth Auction. A total of 103 Barrows will sell in the Youth Auction.
- 8. Class Weigh-back:** All barrows penned in each class will be weighed back at judging. Barrows that weigh 10 lbs. less than the declared weight or more than 10 lbs. above the declared weight will be disqualified.
- 9. Scales:** Exhibitors are not allowed to bring portable scales into the buildings. Scales for weighing are furnished.
